Family history notes:



150 years ago in 1861 - The Civil War began.

Check out Snidows in the Civil War on our website.

200 years ago in 1811:

- Col. Christian Snidow began representing Giles County in the Virginia House of Delegates (General Assembly). He served during the following terms: 1811/1812, 1812/1813, 1818/1819, 1820/1821 and 1821/1822.
- Philip Snidow (Christian's older brother) had been deceased for 19 years.
- Jacob Snidow already had seven children by this time.

(Native Virginian James Madison was the President of the United States)

220 years ago in 1791 - John Snidow (Jr.) apparently died. (He was listed in the 1790 tithables but his name did not appear in 1791 or thereafter) He was probably in his mid-to-late twenties.

232-235 years ago - John Jacob & Elizabeth Helm Snidow's sons Philip, Christian, Theophilus and Jacob Snidow served in the American Revolution.

240 years ago in 1771 - Elizabeth Helm Snidow petitioned the court in October so that she could administer the estate of her late husband, John Jacob Snidow.
